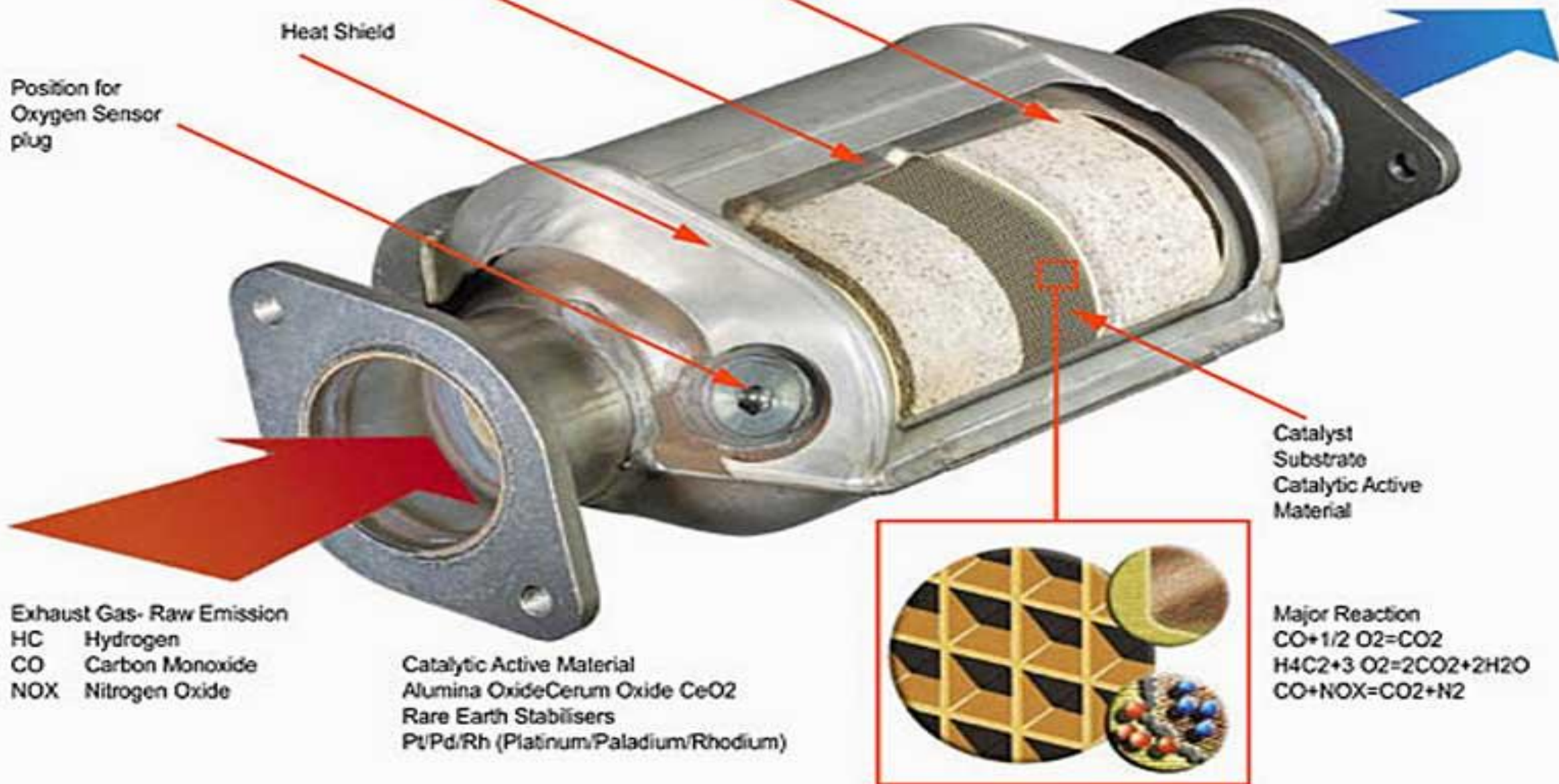

What You Can Do To Deter Package Theft



Utilizing a combination of the following tips can reduce the likelihood of thieves stealing your packages:

- ✓ Always track your shipment online.
- ✓ Choose a shipping option that requires a signature for delivery.
- ✓ Schedule packages to arrive when you are home or arrange to ship your packages to a location where a friend, relative, trusted neighbor, or building super can accept them on your behalf.
- ✓ Ship packages to your place of employment.
- ✓ Request the delivery service hold your package for pick-up at their facility.
- ✓ Utilize deliveries to retailer provided lockers or carrier provided alternate drop points where you can go to pick up your item.
- ✓ Utilize free services that track packages, redirect packages to convenient locations for pick-up, and request vacation holds.
- ✓ Some shipping companies utilize tracking services which can include features such as shipping status notifications and delivery scheduling. Check to see if these services are available in your area.

Where applicable, consider installing:

- ✓ Wi-Fi enabled cameras that provide alerts.
- ✓ Motion-sensor lighting.
- ✓ Package lock-boxes.

Report suspicious persons to the police.

ATM Skimming

Skimming is an illegal activity that involves the installation of a device, usually undetectable by ATM users, that secretly records bank account data when the user inserts an ATM card into the machine. Criminals can then encode the stolen data onto a blank card and use it to loot the customer's bank account.

- 1 Hidden camera**
A concealed camera is typically used in conjunction with the skimming device in order to record customers typing their PIN into the ATM keypad. Cameras are usually concealed somewhere on the front of the ATM—in this example, just above the screen in a phony ATM part—or somewhere nearby (like a light fixture).
- 2 Skimmer**
The skimmer, which looks very similar to the original card reader in color and texture, fits right over the card reader—the original card reader is usually concave in shape (curving inward), while the skimmer is more convex (curving outward). As customers insert their ATM card, bank account information on the card is "skimmed," or stolen, and usually stored on some type of electronic device.
- 3 Keypad overlay**
The use of a keypad overlay—placed directly on top of the factory-installed keypad—is a fairly new technique that takes the place of a concealed camera. Instead of visually recording users punching in their PINs, circuitry inside the phony keypad stores the actual keystrokes.



-Inspect the ATM, gas pump, or credit card reader before using it...be suspicious if you see anything loose, crooked, or damaged, or if you notice scratches or adhesive/tape residue.

2004 style Federal Reserve notes (FRNs) incorporate background colors and large, borderless portrait images.

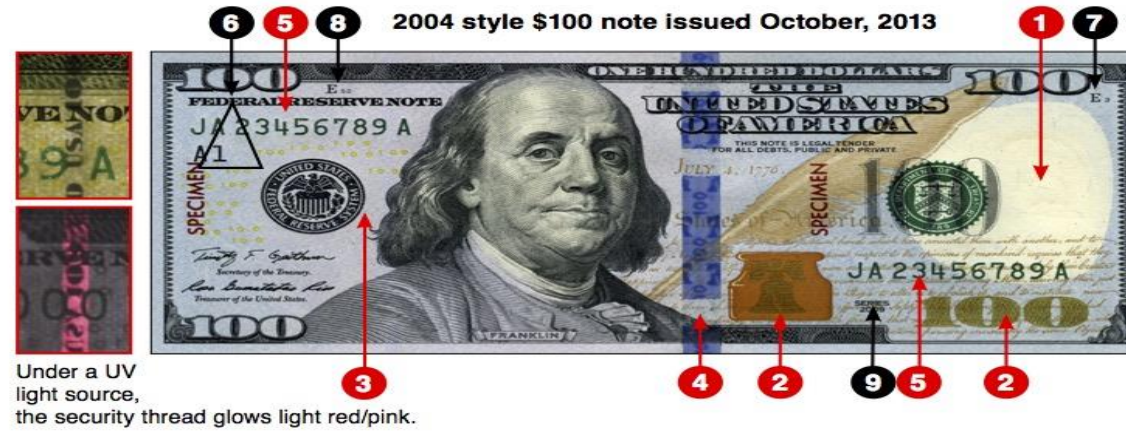
Paper U.S. currency paper consists of 25% linen and 75% cotton and contains small randomly dispersed red and blue security fibers embedded throughout the paper.

Portrait The 2004 style FRNs have an enlarged and off-center portrait without a frame.

- 1 Watermark** The 2004 style FRNs have a watermark that is visible from either side when held to light.
- 2 Color-Shifting Ink** The 2004 style \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100 FRNs have color-shifting ink that shifts from copper to green as the note is tilted 45 degrees. The 2004 style \$100 FRN has a color-shifting "Bell in the Inkwell". The \$5 FRN does not have color-shifting ink.
- 3 Security Thread** All genuine FRNs, except the \$1 and \$2, have a clear thread embedded vertically in the paper. The thread is inscribed with the denomination of the note and is visible only when held to light. Each denomination has a unique thread position and glows a different color when held to ultraviolet (UV) light.
- 4 3-D Security Ribbon** The 2004 style \$100 FRN features a blue ribbon woven into the paper. When you tilt the note back and forth, the bells and "100"s move side to side. If you tilt the note side to side, they move up and down.
- 5 Serial Numbers** The first letter of the serial number on FRNs of series year 1996 or later corresponds to the series year.
 E = 2004 I = 2006 L = 2009A
 G = 2004A J = 2009

Bank Indicators

- 6 Federal Reserve Indicators** The 2004 style FRNs have a letter and number designation, which identifies one of the 12 distributing Federal Reserve Banks. This letter and number designation appears beneath the serial number on the left. The number corresponds to the position of the letter in the alphabet, e.g.: A1, B2, C3, etc. The letter matches the second prefix letter in the serial number.
- 7 Note Position Letter and Number**
- 8 Face Plate Number**
- 9 Series Year**
- 10 Back Plate Number** (Not shown) Found on the bottom right-hand corner of the back of the note.
